2017 SEASON RECAP

In 2017, *Niagara* travelled 3,179 nautical miles, on Lake Erie, Lake Ontario, and the St. Lawrence Seaway

2017 marked another year of strong growth for the sail training program



149 trainee berths were filled during the 2017 sailing season. This is the second consecutive year that the sailing program has been sold out.

Rigging Practicum April 2017

This program was designed for professionals and aspiring professionals in the traditional sailing vessel field. Trainees helped up-rig Niagara while learning and practicing traditional marlin-spike seamanship skills, as well as participating in preseason training sails.

High School Programs Exploring the Great Lakes

Session I: June 7 – 20

Session II: June 22 – July 6



This program was split into two sessions and gave trainees the opportunity to sail on *Niagara* visiting historical sites in Put-In-Bay, Tall Ships festivities in the Toronto region and a transit through the Welland Canal. The curriculum focused on the fundamentals of square-rig seamanship and developing the skills and personal qualities to meet the challenges of life on board a ship.

College Program History Under Sail May 10 - May 31



This program focused on the fundamentals of square-rig seamanship and comparative public history. The program began and ended in Erie, PA, and included sailing voyages to the major maritime museums and monuments of Lake Erie.

Individual Trainee Program

Session I: July 7 – July 21

Session II: July 21 – August 1



This program gave individual trainees the opportunity to become an active part of the crew, learning skills of traditional square-rig seamanship through sailing, maintaining and living on the ship. Trainees really got a chance to see it all as they visited various ports in New York, Ontario, and Quebec with three Tall Ships festivals in two weeks during session II.



Maritime Academy Program

August 9 – August 22

Focuses on developing seamanship skills and providing experiences that are directly relevant to careers in the maritime trades. The program begins and ends in Erie, PA, with visits to Lake Erie ports.

Williams – Mystic Program Williams College & Mystic Seaport September 2017



Seventeen students and four faculty from the Williams-Mystic Program sailed onboard *Niagara* during the fall of 2017. The Williams-Mystic Program is a collaboration between The Maritime Studies Program of Williams College and Mystic Seaport, and is one of the most prestigious and well-regarded maritime studies programs in the U.S.

The program is "an experiential, interdisciplinary, research-intensive semester about the ocean," which includes field seminars on the Atlantic, Pacific, and Gulf Coasts incorporates a voyage aboard a tall ship. While onboard, students enjoyed a nearly non-stop program of voyaging, coursework, and round-the-clock scientific sampling, packing the most they could into a short time.



Rendez-vous 2017

2017 marked departure from the pattern of the last several years in that *Niagara* set her sights eastward. The ship participated in Rendezvous 2017, a major festival series organized by Sail Training International, which coincides with the 150th anniversary of the confederation of Canada.

Niagara visited ports throughout Canada and finally Quebec City, for a culminating event at which more than 40 ships from around the world were in attendance.



FNL is excited to announce a programmatic collaboration with the South Street Seaport Museum to operate the *Lettie G. Howard. Lettie* is a historic, 1892 fishing Schooner, which has been operating out of New York City for the past several years. This collaboration will allow FNL to reach younger students while sailing year-round, including on the Atlantic Ocean.
